Short description of the professional and teaching experience including research interests

Wolfram Kaiser has been Professor of European Studies at the University of Portsmouth in the UK since 2000, where he teaches European/European Union politics and history. He has also been a Visiting Professor at the College of Europe since 1996. His main research interest is the EU. He is particularly interested in the linked processes of supranational integration and transnational society formation. His most recent book *Christian Democracy and the Origins of European Union* (CUP 2007) addresses the role of transnational party elite networks in European integration. Wolfram Kaiser also has broader interests in the processes of Europeanisation and globalisation. He has authored and edited many books and articles for journals including *Comparativ*, *Contemporary European History*, *Geschichte in Wissenschaft und Unterricht*, *Historical Journal*, *Journal of Common Market Studies*, *Journal of Contemporary History*, *Journal of European Integration History*, *Journal of European Public Policy*, *Journal of Modern History*, *Journal of Public Policy*, and *Revue d'histoire diplomatique*.
